Upon taking over at BAE Systems Australia, Jim established the company's headquarters in Adelaide, South Australia where he lives.

Jim was Chief Executive Officer of BAE Systems Saudi Arabia a \$6 billion company from September 2011 to December 2013.

He has in-depth experience in corporate governance having served, mainly as Chair on a range of boards including the Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation, Air Warfare Destroyer Principals Council, Total Construction Pty Ltd and Australian Defence Accelerator Ltd. He is a non-executive director of both Codan Ltd and Austal Ltd and a Board Member of the Royal Automobile Association (RAA), Adelaide Football Club, The Australian Strategic Policy Institute Council and St Peter's College Council of Governors.

Jim acts in a number of advisory roles to the Minister and the Department of Defence as a member of the First Principles Review of the Department and the Expert Advisory Panel for the Future Submarine Project.
