

SMARTNet: right information, right person, right time

Sharing information in complex warfighting environments is challenging because military radios:

- have limited bandwidth
- are continually being blocked by buildings, the terrain, or the enemy
- have increasing numbers of users, wanting to share more and more data.

Unlike existing systems, SMARTNet will help soldiers cope with this complexity by adjusting the rate, amount, and priority of data as network and mission conditions change.
